

**CGSA Code of Conduct/Umpire Protocol**  
**2006 Spring Season**

CGSA will have zero (0) tolerance towards abusive language, gestures or actions of un-sportsman like conduct by umpires, managers, coaches, players, relatives, or spectators. Combative arguing, abusive comments, cursing, negative comments towards umpires, players, coaches or spectators from any person will not be tolerated.

In situations that disrupt the flow or good will spirit of a game, as determined by the CGSA contracted Umpire, the following protocol should be followed.

- 1) **First Warning:** Upon request from the Umpire to the offending team manager or head coach, it will be that person's sole responsibility to correct any of the above infractions immediately, or risk ejection.
- 2) **Second Warning:** The manager or head coach will be ejected with risk of forfeiture if they do not leave the grounds immediately.
- 3) **Third Warning:** (NONE) should any of the above infractions continue, the game will be declared a forfeit on the offending team by the Umpire.

If a game forfeiture occurs during the first game of a two or three game series, the Umpire should contact a CGSA league official to determine if additional games will be played. Any manager or coach ejected or persons as determined by the CGSA league official to have been negatively involved will not be permitted to return for the following game or games on that day. And upon proper review by the Board may be subject to dismissal from the league.

Umpires should limit communication in these types of situations to the Manager, Head Coach or CGSA league official only.

Ejections should be limited to the team Manager or Head Coach which ever is determined by the Umpire to be in charge of the team.
